Reduction of Administrative Burden

Real Estate

Bureaucracy in real estate development is being reduced, shortening project timelines by up to 70%.

Business Environment

Simplified regulations for micro-enterprise tax administration and support for innovation, streamlining procedures for large investments and reducing administrative hurdles.

Healthcare

Eased administrative processes by introducing e-health solutions (e.g., registering vaccinations and lab results digitally) and reducing paperwork.

Telecommunications

Legislative reforms to ease the deployment of 5G infrastructure, with simplified access to real estate for mobile base stations

Public Procurement

Centralized procurement to improve efficiency and transparency in acquiring goods and services, reducing administrative load across sectors.

Workforce and Tax

Labor tax reforms aimed at simplifying the tax system, benefiting both businesses and employees

Extension of tax payment deadlines through automated processes

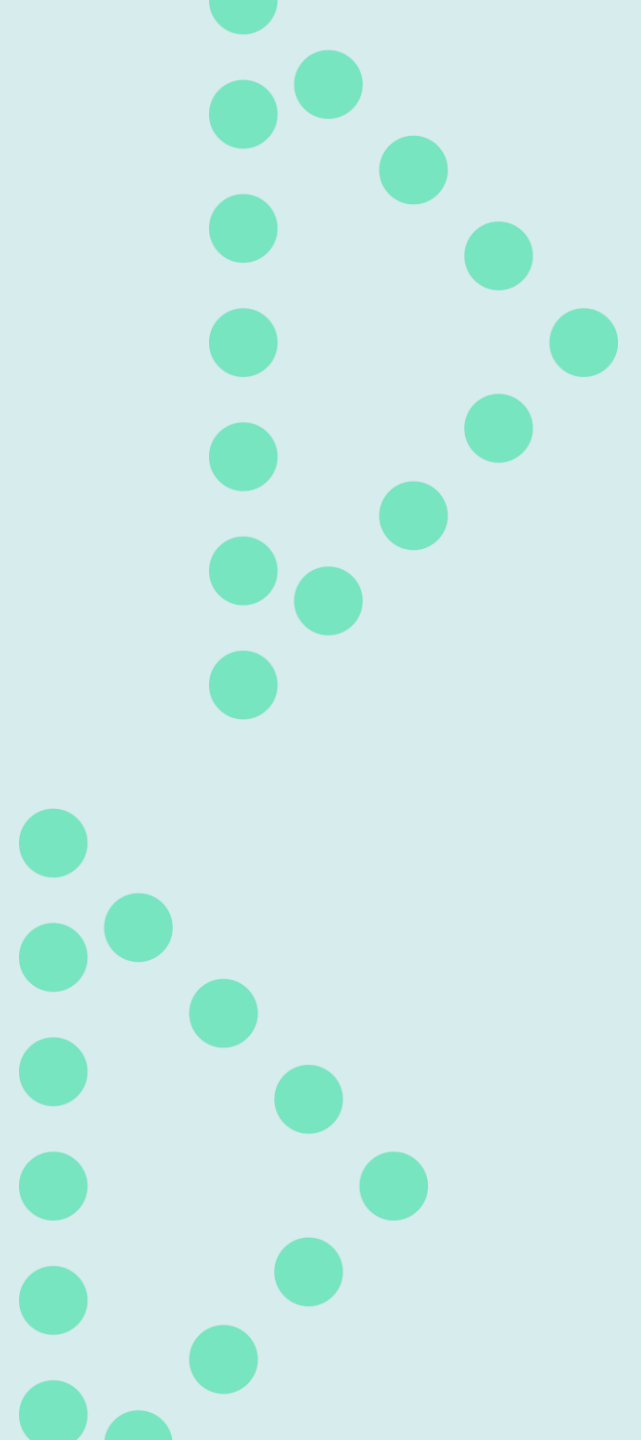
Introduction of a taxpayer rating system, where "A" level businesses receive VAT overpayment refunds within 5 days

Reduction of the administrative burden for enterprises with faster registration of changes at the Register of Enterprises

Further Simplifications in Tax Administration: higher non-recoverable tax debt thresholds, more frequent late payment charge calculations, and streamlined cash register re-certification for A-level taxpayers
